Manfreda longiflora (Rose) Verhoek-Williams, comb. nov. Runyonia longiflora Rose, Addisonia 7: 39. 1922.

The included style and sessile anthers of this species led J. N. Rose to name it as the type of a separate genus. However, since the species is apparently very closely related to <u>M. maculosa</u> it is difficult to justify keeping it generically separate. Vegetatively <u>M. longiflora</u> and <u>M. maculosa</u> are nearly identical. <u>Manfreda longiflora</u> and <u>M. maculosa</u> also have in common stigmas with lobes that reflex at maturity and whitish flowers that become pink or red with age.
